We touched base with some of our past Management Committee & Secretariat members - here's what they had to say about the last 20 years and what the future holds...



"Social Europe is probably better in some ways but in many ways we seem to be devaluing social development in Europe for economic growth. There is a greater awareness of the need for basic social protection but often it remains that – basic.

"Social Platform has kept talking and advocating throughout all the negative and policy changes and that, I think, means the debate is alive and well. Social Platform has also built on the experience of members and I think has been able to share reality."

"I am afraid that social Europe seems more like words than reality now, rather than what seemed to be the position 20 years ago. We do have important commitments on paper and these were hard won by social NGOs and others with a concern for social Europe, but as a colleague said, 'you can't eat paper.'

"I believe the situation would be even worse without the actions of people and organisations committed to the achievement of fundamental rights for all, including economic social and cultural rights. Social Platform has played a part in that struggle."

"The expression 'social Europe' in itself is incorrect. Europe is an economic construction, with a social dimension. There is, for instance, no exclusive social competence in the Treaties!

"This social dimension has regressed, despite a deceptive discourse. We talk more about the social dimension, but the declared social ambitions are contradictory to the economic and political neoliberal choices made by the Council and the Commission. Hence, we had the failure of the Lisbon Strategy, and the foreseen failure of Europe 2020, at least for its social dimension."
