Although the EU legislates against discrimination in the work place, it has no rules in place to fight unequal treatment in other areas of life.

We believe that everyone has the right not to be discriminated against - not just those in employment. This is why we are fighting for antidiscrimination laws on all grounds, no matter a person's social, economic or residence status.

Everyone is entitled to live a life in dignity, but this most basic of rights is being challenged in the EU by rising levels of poverty and social exclusion.
